To the Surveyor of *Military lands* Secretary of State,
William H. Bell

Pursuant to a resolution of the General Assembly passed the *24th* day of *December* 1821, you are hereby required as soon as may be to lay off and survey for the *benefit* of *the State* *the* *lands* *containing* *the* *residue* *of* *the* *lands* *acquired* *by* *the* *officers* *and* *soldiers* *of* *the* *Continental* *Army* *of* *this* *State*.

Observing the directions of the act of Assembly in such case made and provided—
 —Two just and fair plans with a certificate to each annexed, you are to transmit with this warrant to the Secretary of State without delay.
